One Light Coming brings us into the life of Harley-riding Jake Axelrod, a carpenter who works hard and plays harder. When Jake gets a call from Karen—the love of his life, who broke his heart when she left him for a plastic surgeon—begging for his help, he is torn. Though he still cares for her Jake is reluctant to get involved, but does it anyway. While waiting on new ID to help Karen disappear, the two of them fall back into their old comfortable routine. At least until her husband shows up.

When Karen meets an untimely death, Jake is charged with her murder. Now on the run, Jake looks for help in dangerous places as he puts his life and freedom on the line to prove his innocence.

One Light Coming is a collaboration between veteran biker-author Edward Winterhalder and newcomer Marc Teatum. Reputed to have been in, or associated with, outlaw biker gangs Winterhalder uses his knowledge of the life to make an extensive contribution to the "Biker Fiction" genre. While Teatum makes his debut tapping into his love of Harleys and writing prowess. Though it's their first time working together, the pair seem to have a collective cohesiveness that results in a well-rounded story.

Despite a few rough spots, Winterhalder and Teatum's collaboration successfully crafts an interesting, action-packed story that moves forward at a steady clip. Protagonist, Jake Axelrod, is a well-developed and sympathetic character, despite his implied bad-boy image. A few well-placed twists provide unexpected jolts that keeps the tension high and the pressure on.

One Light Coming is an entertaining thrill ride through the biker life. No Harley required.

Book Review, "One Light Coming"

"ONE LIGHT COMING, A Biker's Story"—by Edward Winterhalder and Marc Teatum.

As an avid reader, I delved into this book about the biker lifestyle with gusto. It wasn't long before I realized it was going to be a distraction to my day to put the book down and do other chores. I wanted to read the book from cover to cover in one sitting. However, I didn't do that. It's gluttony to read such a well researched and written story without stopping to digest its meaning and possible outcomes.

The collaboration between Winterhalder and Teatum is one that agrees with me. Marc's storyline is believable and Winterhalder's knowledge of club life, brotherhood and bonds cement the story with its relationships between the independent biker and the 1%er.

The chronicle begins in Boston and travels from there throughout the northeast. With Axelrod (the main character in the story) escaping from police custody in Boston (with the help from an officer who sounds an awful lot like a police officer I knew in Melbourne, Florida). Axelrod finds himself riding a semi-truck out of state with his bike crated in the back of a moving van. Trouble finds him even here, but without the trouble he finds at this juncture, the story couldn't have continued. This is where the tale picks up steam. It's here the lifestyle of the Brotherhood actually becomes cohesive: weaving together the lives of strangers with a common thread of respect, honor and motorcycles.

This story is one that could possibly happen. It tells the story of men and women who understand "THE CODE": people who live by it. It lets ya into a side of club life that's open to the rare persona whose own personal code of individualism runs harmoniously alongside the code of a 1% club. At least that's what I took away from this story. I believe the narrative is complex enough to give different meanings to all who open the cover and decide to read with an open mind.

Would I keep this book on my BIKER BOOKSHELF? Yup.
