

Gaining unprecedented insider perspective, it's interesting to learn that the customs and trappings of traditional biker culture; the rituals and pastimes, the block parades, the barbeque parties, the bikini bike wash, the bike runs, the drag races, the raunchy fundraising parties, and, of course, the "biker chicks", really transcend color and motor preference. 

captured the annual motorcycle rally and the culture it inspires since the 1970s. His name is synonymous with Biker photography. The magnificent aura and personality of this multi-

While many of Barger's precepts are standard self-help fare, they are nonetheless lessons in confidence, courage, honesty and individuality. It's the kind of book that can ride along in your saddlebag and pulled out from time to time when you think you need direction.
